

At St Luke's Church of England (Aided) Primary School, we value the feedback we receive from our parents/carers. Thank you to those parents/carers who completed and returned the evaluation forms after the [Nursery Phase 1 and sounds workshops held on 5th December 2017 \(am/pm\)](#).

The focus of the workshop was for parents to understand the process of phase 1 and how to support their child in these activities at St.Luke's. This included a home learning activity book being created with activities to complete at home; linked to phase 1 activities. Parents were given support with understanding the systematic approach to phonics using RWI, how to say the sounds, handwriting ditties, oral blending and the importance of story time activities.

From the evaluation forms that were returned, responses were analysed and the results are as follows and comments made to any issues highlighted:

Summary of findings

Other areas of support needed:

As a suggestion - wondering whether children in nursery are allowed to bring books home once a week? To keep a child encouraged and for them to learn the importance and value of reading.

More learning together sessions for reading and writing
