Welcome back to everyone and to those new families who have joined us! I hope that you all had a good break over Easter and are feeling refreshed and ready for our final term of 2018-19. So what exciting things are happening across the school this term?

In Nursery and Reception the children will be experiencing many different activities particularly focusing around the children's interests. They will also be making use of the gardening area outside of Nursery.



Right up my street is Year 1's topic and they will be learning about the local area of Blakenhall and comparing it to a different locality, the seaside and a country. The children will hopefully be visiting the seaside!

Year 2's topic for this term is **The 'Wander' of Wolves**; The children will be learning about the geographical area of Wolverhampton, how it is a city, the history of Wolverhampton and the impact that our city has had on the rest of the country! We are hoping that the children will be able to visit the Molineux!



Bostin' ay it! is the topic for Year 3. The children will be learning about the wider geographical area of 'The Black Country', how our city fits in with the wider county and the history of this area. The children will be going to the Black Country Living Museum.

Year 4's topic is **Come over to Maya Place!** The children will be studying the Mayan culture, their writing and number systems, their food, religion and beliefs. They are also learning about where the Mayans lived, their lifestyles and homes. As part of their topic, the children will be visiting Cadbury World.



In year 5, the topic is **'River deep, Mountain high'** as the children learn about rivers and mountains in both the UK and Europe. They will study the water cycle and how both rivers and mountains are formed.

Here, there and everywhere is Year 6's topic this term. The children will complete a geographical comparison of North America and the UK. They will investigate physical geography including: climates, biomes and earthquakes as well as the human geography such as: land use, settlements, tourism and economic activity.



And of course there will be lots of different visits and activities to look forward to including Year 2's residential to Kingswood; Health & Sports Week and Sports Day towards the end of term - Busy but exciting times at St Luke's!
